


## Kasiyanna

This is collaborative project with Lingkod Maria Community Development and Advocacy Center of Saint Mary's University - Bayombong.












#### **Chastity Issue**




## Cut and Paste Revolution



#### Pao Edition

Proceeds from our maiden issue were used to fund The Volume Project: Pao Edition in December 0I, 20I9, our .first outreach program in Kasibu, Nueva Vizcaya to plant a library at Pao Elementary School and supply other much needed resources for fifty pupils and teachers.













#### Braver Together Edition

In May 2020, we raised Php 116,285 for our country's frontliners and essential workers through The Volume Project: #BraverTogether. With the sales of Issue 02, we carried the project forward, and extended it to another edition to support more frontliners, essential workers, and communities heavily stricken by the COVID-19 crisis.











#### Braver Together #ArtRescue

In November 2020, The Volume Project: #BraverTogether ArtRescuePH raised Php132, 482.36 through artwork sales and cash donations. Ten waves of donations were sent to fellow Filipinos who were affected by Typhoon Ulysses in Cagayan and Metro Manila.









#### Hanginan Edition

In August 30, 2021, we donated 73 new books and school supplies worth Php6,500 to 30 kids in Hanginan, Brgy. Rogongon, Iligan City, Lanao Del Norte. This edition of TVP was conducted in coordination with Bookids (Books for Kids in the Bukids), a non-government organization headed by Kai Lee Zalsos Uychiat that is dedicated to helping children in the hinterlands improve their literacy skills.











#### Braver Together #ArtRescue V2.0

In December 2021, The Volume Project: #BraverTogether ArtRescuePH V2.0 and Manila Collage Collective raised Php53, 702.00 through the digial copy sales of the Cut and Paste Revolution issue and cash donations. Five waves of donations were sent to fellow Filipinos who were affected by Typhoon Odette in Cebu, Negros Occidental, Siargao Island, and Palawan.













#### Maasin Edition

Donations and proceeds from our third issue were used to fund The Volume Project: Maasin Edition in January 08, 2022. In this edition of The Volume Project, we were able to give care packs with school supplies; sanitary kits, and snacks to 50 pupils of Maasin Elementary School in Brgy. Maasin, Quezon, Nueva Vizcaya.
